## Working Our Way Back to Empowering our Participants with Special Needs

Since August of 2020, The Douglas Center has slowly welcomed back some of our program participants under the direction of the DHS (Department of Health and Human Services) Covid-19 guidelines. Over time we have gradually increased the attendance as allowed.

Safety first has always been our highest priority. The Douglas Center conducts weekly Covid-19 testing for all our staff and our participants. All participants attending The Douglas Center program have been vaccinated. We have also advocated and successfully arranged for homebase participants to be vaccinated. They have received the 1st dose and The Douglas Center has made transportation arrangements for participants vaccinations to and from Chicago Reed in Oak Park. The Douglas Center would



like to express our deepest gratitude to the Skokie Public Health Department for their guidance in assisting us in the understanding the Covid-19 guidelines and in arranging for our staff to be vaccinated through the Skokie Public Health Department. Their professionalism and generosity of time in responding to our questions was greatly appreciated.

We are overjoyed in welcoming back our participants with special needs. People with disabilities have suffered disproportionately during the pandemic due to the shutdowns. They have experienced losses in job training, employment opportunities/income, lack of social interaction and isolation. These losses can be difficult for most, but for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities, they can be devastating. The type of programming offered by The Douglas Center assists people with disabilities to live fuller lives by developing skills that assist them in integrating into the community. However, the longer that they are without this support they begin to lose the skills that they have acquired. We are so excited to be able to restart the process back to empowerment. 
